

Sports Premium Funding

At Brent Knoll, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children. Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per year to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years - here at Brent Knoll that will mean around £8,675 a year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools, but we have the freedom to choose how we do this.

SPORTS and OUTDOOR EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT PLAN 2017/18

OBJECTIVES:

- To raise sporting opportunities for all pupils within school.
- To engage pupils with competitive sports.
- To engage pupils in sporting opportunities outside of school.
- To raise the profile of sports within the CLP and other local schools.

TOTAL INCOME: £8000 school grant plus 135 x £5 = £8,675 for 2017/18.

July 2017 update: There has been notification that the sports grant will double to £16 000 (plus £10 per child) for the Year 2017/18. The conditions of grant have not been published yet. However the CLP has already discussed how some of these extra funds could be used to employ two sports apprentices in the area, to plan and deliver a range of sporting activities to the benefit of all children.
