Anticipated Spend: Total budget of £8,393

To continue to raise the quality and profile of PE and sport in school, ensuring that standards are at least good, we will:

➤ **Hire qualified sports coaches to teach across the school**

We have continued to organise specialist coaches to come into school i.e. Football, Cricket, Netball and Ballroom Dancing.

➤ **Continue to participate in the local sports hub**

In partnership with other local primary schools within our cluster, we will continue to participate in the local sports hub. This will enable us to access support and opportunities to participate in tournaments

➤ **Provide places for pupils in after school sports clubs**

Our school already offers a range of after school clubs, accessed by children from Key Stage 1 & 2. These clubs will continue to run as before. We aim to provide clubs for Football, Cricket, Rugby, Netball, Running and Athletics. Some clubs will run throughout the year and others will be seasonal

➤ **Provide opportunities for children to compete**

Our PE Co-ordinator will organise tournaments between the local primaries, whilst offering further opportunities for our more gifted children, allowing them to compete against other children at a higher level. This year we have competitively competed in Cross Country, Rugby, Football, Cricket and Hockey

➤ **Provide playground games at lunchtimes**

Lunchtime Supervisors who engage with children's play can transform lunchtimes. KS2 pupils have improved their leadership and organisational skills by attending training to enable the organising of games set at a level for KS1 to participate in

➤ **Introduce "Warm-Up Wednesday"**

This year all pupils successfully and enjoyably participated in a weekly aerobic session. This whole school exercise regime improved concentration at the start of the day whilst also improving general fitness levels. It has also allowed KS2 children to have the opportunity to become involved as Leaders by organising their fitness routines

➤ **Work towards the Sainsbury School Games Mark**

Having successfully achieved the "Gold" Mark, children across the school will continue to keep standards high whilst developing their skills to maintain this level

➤ **We have also:**

- Paid for transport to various events together with the hire of the village hall for gymnastics and dance
- Purchased new and additional sports equipment to cater for larger class sizes
- Paid for disadvantaged children to participate in the school's PGL Residential Trip
- Provided ingredients for KS1 children to become actively involved in a weekly cooking session, helping them to understand the importance of a balanced and healthy diet
- Provided cover to release teachers for professional development in PE and Sport and to attend sports events
- Having met the cost of the installation of the Defibulator and cabinet previously, we have now funded training in the use of the Defibulator for both the school and the community
- Paying for necessary weekly supplies to enable KS1 to engage in Forest School activities, involving aspects of outdoor learning together with Health & Safety
- The hire of equipment i.e. porta-loo for Sports Day, as the school field is not attached to the school grounds

Budget 2016/2017 (£8,393)

- £2,000 to employ external providers
- £1,800 event transport and hire of village hall for gymnastics and dance
- £2,093 equipment, resources and repairs
- £1,000 PGL Residential
- £1,500 supply cover for CPD and staff release to take part in inter-school competitions in school time

Success Criteria

- All areas of the PE curriculum are at least good
- Increased after school clubs and participation in PE and Sport - links with specialist organisations and coaches
- Pupils have greater opportunities to participate in competitions
- Pupils who are more able in sport are given the chance to participate against others of a similar ability and potential
- Pupils will have high self-esteem and sense of pride for their teams
- KS2 Pupils have more opportunity to develop their leadership skills
- Parents have a more interactive involvement with the child's involvement in sporting activities

- Involved the community in a Christmas Ballroom Tea Dance, thus using the skills taught through the dance tuition made available to the pupils. This has also increased pupils' social skills, self-esteem and encouraged their interaction with the community
- As a result of upskilling staff, increased knowledge and skills have been passed onto the children
