Dear Parent/Carer

Re: Pupil Medication

The administration of medicines to children is a parental responsibility. However, if your son/daughter requires medication during the school day we as a school have agreed to be a representative and provide pupils with the necessary medication. We must have written permission setting out the necessary instructions as detailed below. If instructions are changed these must be notified in writing. Verbal instructions cannot be accepted.

Please provide medicines in an original dispensed container specifically for school use with the following information on the label:-

- name and strength of medicine
- dose
- time of administration e.g. lunch, between 12 noon -1 pm
- length of treatment/stop date where appropriate
- expiry date whenever possible

Medicine should have been dispensed within the last three months. It is the parent/carer's responsibility to update any medication the school holds indefinitely.

Pupils who use inhalers for asthma should continue to carry them with them in the usual way.
