Summary of Impact 2016-2017

All pupils from Year1 upwards have been involved in at least one intra tournament. The children worked with sports coach, Bob Brunt to take part in indoor curling intra competition playing in house teams. From Year 2 upwards all pupils have taken part in at least 4 intra sporting competitions using the house system set up in school (athletics, netball, tag rugby and football). This includes children who have special needs or who are not so confident in sporting activity.

The whole-school have one hour of PE with a PE coach each week and have taken part in a range of different activities including multi-skills, football, gymnastics, dance, tag-rugby and netball. The PE coach worked with all pupils across the whole year. Throughout this time the staff observed aspects of the PE lesson to improve their own skills when delivering the other PE lesson which the children have every week.

All children have had access to swimming lessons at the swimming pool. By the end of the year their progress was evaluated by analysing the children's swimming assessments.

Inter-School Competitions

The school has been involved in three inter school competitions during the last year. By using PE grant to fund salary costs to organise training and staff attending the event has allowed the school to be involved in these competitions. It is planned that this will increase to 6 inter-school competitions in 2017-2018.

Football

Haselbury school has had a joint football team with Merriott First school and took part in a local Football festival hosted at Maiden Beech in the autumn term. This enabled children who enjoy football or not even considered playing taking part in a tournament. A further football tournament took place in Ilminster in the spring term.

Cross Country

During the autumn and spring term, Haselbury entered teams for the 6 Yeovil district cross-country events along with our partnership school, Merriott. Mrs Copping HLTA (funded by Sports funding) and parent volunteers ensured the team was well organised and a group of approximately 10 pupils took part consistently throughout the season. The children also took part in various other cross-country events including Slay the Dragon at Hinton and Haselbury Trail. The children proudly showed their medals and certificates at praise assemblies throughout the year.



Gymnastics

The whole school pupil community have benefited from gymnastic lessons from sports coach and the teaching staff have observed his teaching and staff have taught lessons following his plans. Many pupils have taken part in a popular gymnastics extra-curricular club. A group of Key Stage 2 children were selected to then represent at the CISP gymnastics festival at Greenfylde School. The group then received training with gym coach,



Germaine Tuff at breakfast club training sessions leading up to level 2 competition at Orchard Gym at Yeovil in March.

Extra-curricular Activities

The academic Year 2016-2017 was very busy year for us in respect of extra –curricular sporting activities. Sporting Clubs were fully funded by the Sports funding grant allowed pupils to try out various sporting clubs over the year with no cost to the pupils. With club evenings occurring 4 days a week after school throughout the year. Clubs included: multi-skills, tennis, dodgeball, athletics, archery, gym club, unihoc and netball sessions. All of these activities were open to Key stage 1 and 2 pupils. By fully funding these clubs a high take up of the clubs was maintained consistently across the whole year. For example, during Spring 1, 80% of key stage 2 pupils were engaged in extra-curricular sporting activities. 78% of all pupils took part in at least one extra-curricular sporting club. Some of these activities have led the children then to carry on and compete for the school such as the gymnastics tournament in March. These results were not recorded by the school in the previous year. It is planned to increase this participation to 85% in 2017-2018.

Pupil Leadership

Children benefited from active lunch times with Year 4 leaders organising play activities. This leads to less incidents of poor behaviour and ensures children remain active at lunch time. It also allows children to develop the leadership skills to lead sport and activities at playtimes. Less active pupils and pupils who need to develop their self-esteem were also targeted as part of this strategy to become playground leaders.

Key Stage 2 pupils have benefited from working with Mr Brunt to develop leadership skills and have gained a Leadership certificate. The young leaders then used these skills to organise with Multi-skills activities with younger children. Some of these leaders prepared to take part in the CISP multi-skills festival.

Mrs Rickard (Merriott HLTA with responsibility for sport) and Mr Smith have attended termly CISP PE meetings and this has enabled us to network with other schools and plan opportunities to work with other schools. Furthermore, we have planned regular opportunities for CISP schools to compete against each other. The idea being each school to organise one festival. Merriott and Haselbury organised the TAG rugby festival in Autumn 2 with the support of the Crewkerne Rugby Club.

Haselbury School is now signed up for the School Games Mark in 2017/2018. An awards scheme launched in 2012 to reward schools for their commitment to the development of sporting competition across their school and into the community. Schools in England are able to assess themselves across bronze, silver and gold levels. Through our competition levels and participation levels in 2016/2017 we met the criteria for silver award. We are all extremely proud of our sporting achievements and we are determined to make gold level in 2017/2018!
