### **Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2015-16**

Supporting children in mathematics, literacy and wider curriculum opportunities with an emphasis on detailed feedback to teacher on how progress can be made. Interventions are implemented as soon as a child drops behind their peers in attainment.

Supporting children in accessing curriculum opportunities such as swimming.

Helping children to improve their self-esteem and self-confidence through accessing 1:1 music tuition, leading to inclusion in performances at music concerts and church recitals.

### **Measuring the impact of PPG spending**

The school will evaluate the impact at the end of each term. Evaluation will focus on academic progress as measured on tracking sheets, SIMs data and also how self-confidence develops as a consequence of the interventions. This evaluation will be between the Head and the class teacher(s) at termly Pupil Progress Meetings.
