Week 1

	English	Maths	Additional Activities.
Monday	<p>Please go to the following link on 'Phonics Play' and play the 'Picnic on Pluto' game:</p> <p>https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/PicnicOnPluto.html</p> <p>Write down 3 of the 'real words' that feature in the game above. Ask your child to put these words into 3 sentences in their 'Home Learning' book. Ask your child to plan and say out loud what they are going to write. Once they have written their sentences ask them to re-read their sentence aloud to check it makes sense, that punctuation is correct etc.</p> <p><i>Opportunities for further learning:</i> Can your child use the conjunction 'and' to add more detail to their writing?</p> <p>Please read to, or with, your child for ten minutes.</p>	<p><u>Counting in 2s:</u> Practise counting in 2s with your child. Make this visual by using pairs of socks/shoes and counting together to find the total. <i>So if there are 3 pairs of socks how many would there be altogether?</i> 2, 4, 6!</p> <p>Play the following interactive game to apply counting in 2s. Click on the link, 'timetables', 'hit the answer'.</p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</p> <p><i>Opportunities for further learning:</i> Play 'hit the question' for the 2x tables.</p>	<p><u>Art</u> Read aloud with your child the 'Hello to Spring' poem. Talk about the signs of spring, e.g. daffodils and lambs. Then can your child draw a picture which shows their vision of this poem.</p>
Tuesday	<p><u>Reading of Common Exception Words</u> Keep a record in your child's 'Home Learning' book of the words your child cannot read. Hide the words your child cannot read around the house. Can your child find these and read them to you?</p> <p>Please read to, or with, your child for ten minutes.</p>	<p><u>Counting in 10s:</u> Practise counting in 10s with your child. Make this visual by using ten fingers/toes and counting together to find the total. <i>So if there are 3 lots of 10 fingers how many would there be altogether?</i> 10, 20, 30!</p> <p>Play the following interactive game to apply counting in 10s. Click on the link, 'timetables', 'hit the answer'.</p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</p> <p><i>Opportunities for further learning:</i> Play 'hit the question' for the 10x tables.</p>	<p><u>Science</u> If there is an area safe to do so, e.g. a garden where your child can be supervised, can you go on a spring hunt. Can you find the objects from the sheet outside?</p> <p><i>Extension:</i></p>

The coldness of winter disappears,

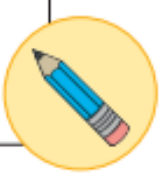
The warmth of spring reappears.
